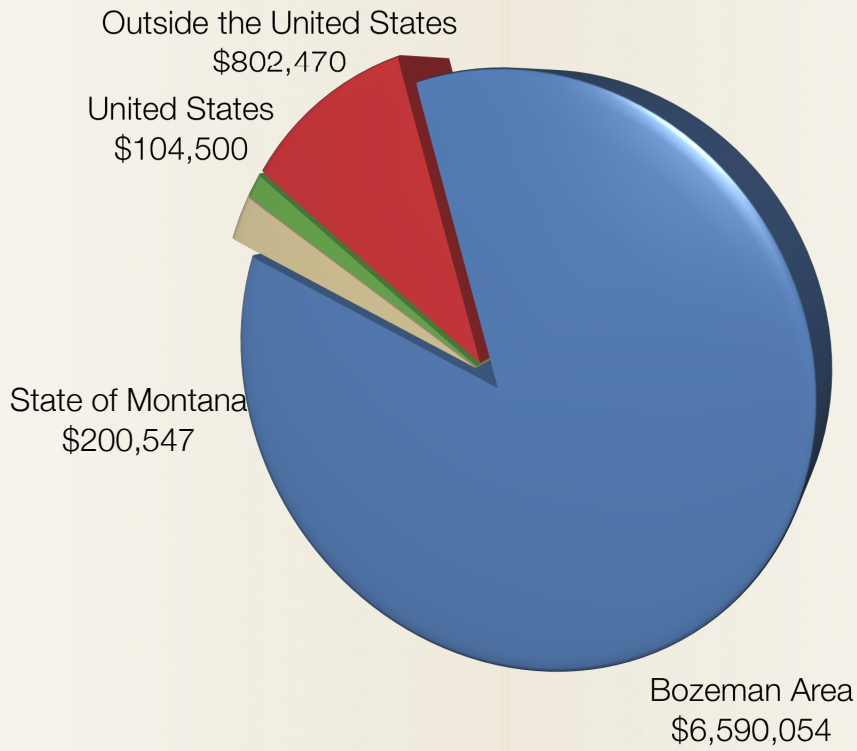
Creating lasting change...

2011 Giving by Geographic Area

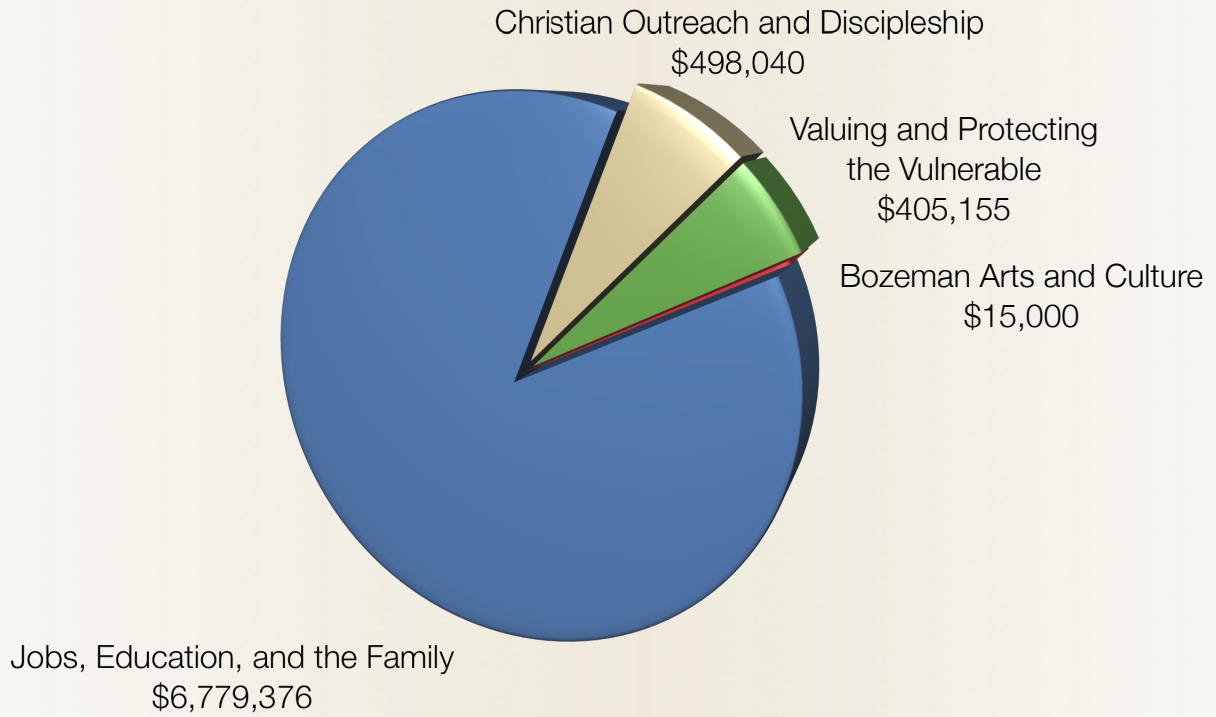

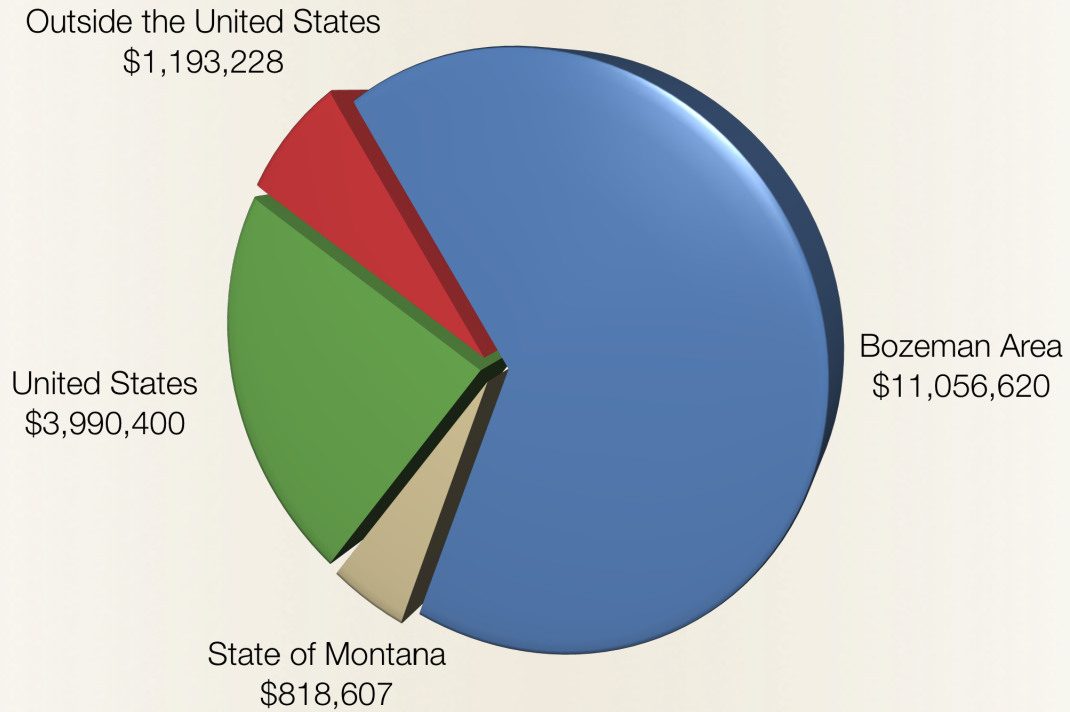
2011 Giving by Focus Area

Cumulative Giving by Geographic Area

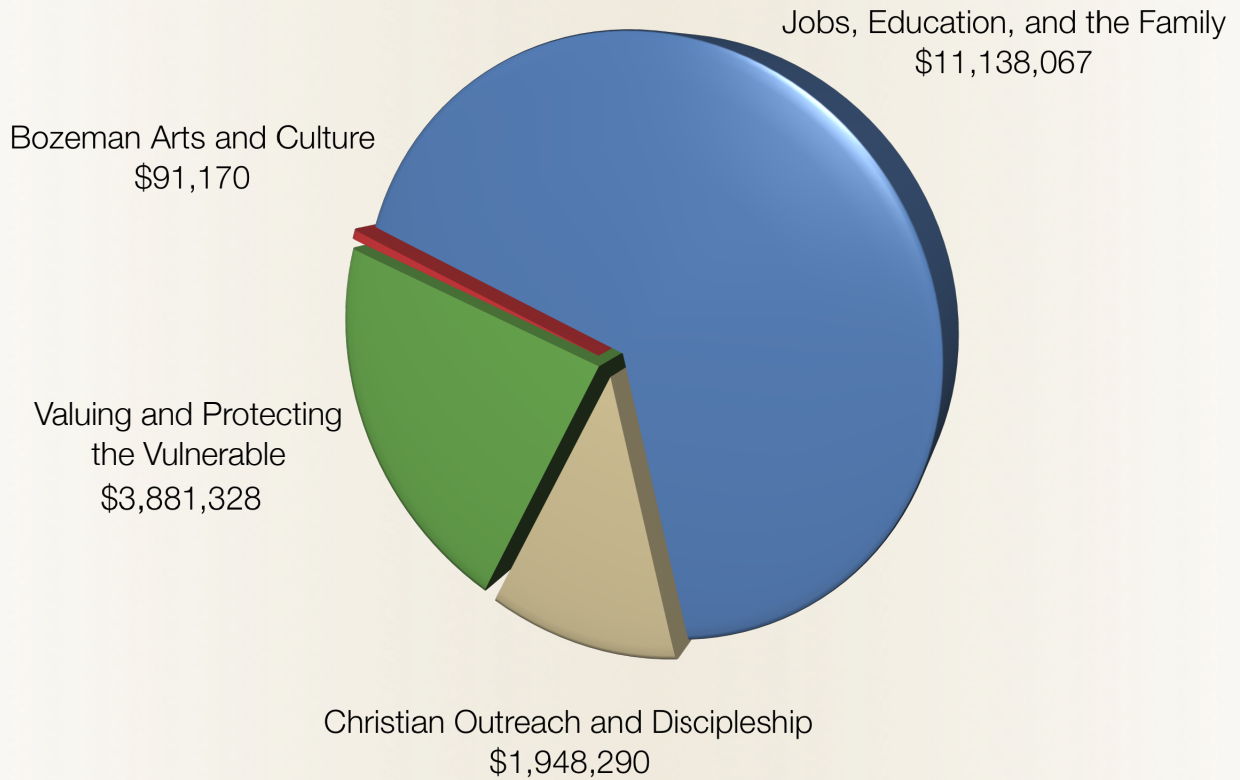

Areas of Focus
